Cars & Carpooling:

Parking is at a premium in camp so please carpool as much as possible. Please drive only on established camp roads. ALL vehicles will need to be parked in the main parking lot and remain there until departure.

Check In:

From 9:15 to 9:45 am Check-in will occur outside Sampson Lodge near the main parking lot at Rodney Scout Reservation. ALL attendees must be checked in. You will receive a program map for the day and your event patch at check-in.

Program Times & Trail Groups:

Family Adventure Day programs will begin at 10am and run until 4:45pm. The program will kick off with an opening ceremony on the parade field at 10 am (near the main parking lot). Adventure programs will run carnival style from 10:15 am to 4:45 pm. Go where you want, when you want, and go again if you like. Travel as a whole Pack or break into smaller groups. Program areas close for lunch from 12:30 – 1:30 pm. There will not be a closing ceremony as participants may leave at various times. The day will be full of adventure and hiking, and some Scouts tire faster than others.

Lunch:

All attendees are responsible for bringing their own lunch/snacks and a water bottle as there will be no food service. Refrigeration and microwaves will not be available, so plan accordingly. You can eat outdoors whenever and wherever you'd like. If you find a good spot and a down moment, feel free to enjoy a snack or your lunch, though program areas close for lunch from 12:30 – 1:30 pm. Trash cans will be in each program area. Remember a Scout is clean.
