Ocean City Reef Foundation Eagle Project

Jacob Massey has been on or around the water since



he could first walk. When as a member of Troop 281 in Oceanview, Delaware, he needed an Eagle project to help him attain the rank, it was natural for him to seek out a project that would benefit the local

benefit the local fishing community. Starting at age 14, as a Life Scout, Jacob

planned and executed the construction of a 10 ton concrete reef in 50' of water nearly 10 miles off the coast of Ocean City, MD. The project was completed in May of 2022 as Jacob turned 16. Dedicated to his former

Jacob's first task was to convince Captain Monty Hawkins of the Ocean City

Foundation that he could do the job.
Once that was

accomplished the project started rolling. Scouts in Troop 281

were organized into work parties to mix concrete, fill the molds, load and unload the 160 pound pyramids, and ultimately launch them onto the ocean floor to rebuild a reef

structure. Jacob next had to overcome some obstacles of poor product quality, extended production time, difficult physical labor, and management of personnel to complete the actual work. Jacob learned project management, people management, and some engineering skills. He determined that his position as a leader was not above his workers, not behind his workers, but with his workers, to get the job done. He made lifelong friends in the process of completing this project.

Jacob dedicated this project to past Troop 281 Committee Chair Peter Kangas. Jacob said Peter had a way of listening to every side of a story, taught him irreplaceable life skills, and made everything he was



involved in better!

Jacob plans to apply to a service academy after completing high school at Indian River High.
