



## **WILLIAM E. HOLLOWAY**

Bill Holloway was raised in New Castle, Delaware and graduated from William Penn High School in 1977. While growing up, Bill was active in Scouting, joining Pack 13 at the age of 9 and progressed through the ranks to Eagle Scout in 1976 with Troop 273 of New Castle. Bill was an Ordeal Member of the Nentego Lodge 20 of the Order of the Arrow and earned his Brotherhood membership with the Octoraro Lodge 22 while an Assistant Scoutmaster with Troop 31 of Chadds Ford, PA. Bill has also served previously as a member of the Del-Mar-Va Council Executive Board in 1987-1989 and also on the Exploring Committee of the Council.
